Background

Bases of the Proposed Model

Principles

- A single independent quality assurance agency is a key element of the national quality assurance framework
- The quality assurance agency should rely on <u>clearly stated minimum</u> <u>acceptable quality</u> that defines a threshold
- The national QA agency should develop <u>specific standards</u>, <u>criteria</u> <u>and reference</u> in order to take into consideration the different types of programmes and organizations
- Peer review is fundamental in the evaluation process conducted in a Quality Assurance system
- The internal and external QA processes are not ranking processes
- The primary <u>responsibility for quality assurance in higher education lies with each institution itself</u> through its <u>commitment to self-study</u>, <u>external peer review</u>, and the <u>employment of quality assurance</u> <u>mechanisms and institutional best practices</u>

Bases of the Proposed Model

Principles (cont.)

- As a result of an evaluation, the national quality assurance agency should <u>identify the strengths</u>, <u>weaknesses and critical points</u>. It is the <u>responsibility of the institution not the agency to define a process to</u> <u>respond to the concerns raised</u>
- The national quality assurance agency <u>could award accreditation or</u> <u>develop quality labels as incentive</u> to the development of quality
- The <u>strength of the link between education and research</u> is a criterion with regard to the quality of university higher education
- A <u>distinction between higher education (post secondary) and university education (based on research) may have sense and stimulate quality</u>
- Stakeholders and students have an active role to play in external and internal quality assurance mechanisms
- External quality assurance should help and foster the development of internal quality assurance mechanisms
- The <u>national quality assurance system should be a learning system</u>
- The <u>national QA agency should be a learning organization</u>
